

RESOLUTION NO.

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3 **WHEREAS**, the City seeks funding to implement safety improvements at
4 high-crash intersections; and

5 **WHEREAS**, the United States Department of Transportation's (USDOT)
6 Fiscal Year 2026 Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary grant
7 program awards funding on a competitive basis to support planning, infrastructure,
8 behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads
9 and streets involving all roadway users; and

10 **WHEREAS**, if obtained, the grant funds will be used to improve between
11 four and six intersections that will achieve stated objectives called for in the SS4A
12 grant program, including further promoting safety, employing low-cost, high-
13 impact strategies that can improve safety at several intersections, ensuring
14 investment in the safety needs of underserved communities, incorporating
15 evidence-based projects and strategies, and aligning with additional priorities such
16 as quality job creation and economic strength and global competitiveness; **NOW,**
17 **THEREFORE,**

18 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

19 The City will partner with Travis County for a Fiscal Year 2026 SS4A
20 application. Travis County will assume the role of lead applicant while the City
21 will submit projects as a partner and concur with the submission of one or more
22 Travis County projects in full purpose jurisdiction. The City will seek
23 implementation funding for targeted investments in post-crash care and emergency
24 medical response systems and to complete major intersections safety projects at
25 two locations.

26 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**

27 The City Manager or designee is authorized to submit a grant application to
28 the USDOT Fiscal Year 2026 SS4A discretionary grant program in an amount not
29 to exceed \$8,000,000, and if awarded a City match not to exceed \$2,000,000.
