Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the agreement with Family Eldercare Inc. d/b/a Family Eldercare to administer the Community Development Block Grant Financial & Housing Stability Program to add a 12-month term, ending on September 30, 2026, in an amount not to exceed \$130,814, and add up to four 12-month extension options for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$1,235,449. Funding: \$130,814 is available in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Austin Housing Department Special Revenue Budget. Funding for the remaining years of the agreement is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Prior Council Action:

September 30, 2021 - Council authorized negotiation and execution of agreements to provide public service activities through the Community Development Block Grant that address underserved and low-income individuals, for an initial 12-month term ending September 30, 2022, with three 12-month extension options, for a total amount not to exceed \$501,844, on an 11-0 vote.

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Additional Backup Information:

Approval of Amendment No. 4 will provide specialized senior services for clients for the term beginning on October 1, 2025, to September 30, 2026. The City's 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan notes the need for senior services for low-income individuals. The Austin Housing Department designates Family Eldercare as a subrecipient for the Senior Services Program contract for Fiscal Year 2025-2026. Family Eldercare provides specialized senior and homeless services with more than twenty years of experience. Funding this program helps prevent and protect Austin residents aged 55 or older from becoming victims of abuse, neglect, or exploitation. Additionally, this program enables them to live independently for as long as possible. The program promotes and fosters increased self-sufficiency, and healthy behaviors and lifestyle among targeted populations. If approved, the agreement will require Family Eldercare to provide services to at least 157 clients. This Agreement will be administered by the Austin Public Health Department.
