- 12 WHEREAS, according to Feeding America Map the Meal Gap Reports in
- 13 2023, 16.4% of children in Travis County's population were food insecure; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the City has an interlocal agreement with Austin Independent
- 15 School District for the provision of resources connecting parents and families to
- 16 family-centered and other social services through parent support specialists; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed budget for fiscal year 2025-2026 includes
- \$1,290,000 in ongoing general funds for parent support specialists; and
- 19 WHEREAS, a pilot program of school food pantries located at Title I
- 20 elementary schools in Austin and surrounding areas had the following outcomes, as
- 21 documented in a Central Texas Food Bank survey of caregiver-participants:
- Increased access to nutritious food,
- Reduced financial strain,
 - Perceived improvement in stress,
 - Improved caregiver's perception of the school,
- Reduced feelings of stigma when needing support from a pantry, and
- Perceived improvement in household's eating habits;
