Reform City Council spending, including but not limited to the criteria used for the type, the amount, and purpose of expenditures. If we want to assure trust, it is critically important for us to be the model for best practices and a place that sets the highest standards.

Peer Practices

Peer Practices



- **Policies:** Austin and peer cities have various administrative bulletins relating to travel, reimbursements, and use of procurement cards.
- **Travel and Reimbursements:** Travel must serve a clear public purpose and fall within established per-diem limits (generally based on federal GSA rates). Documentation and timely submission are required across all cities.

Peer Practices



- **Training:** Austin and peer cities require ethics or financial disclosure training for elected officials, in addition to procurement card training when a card is obtained.
- **Council Office Accounts:** Dedicated Council Office accounts vary. Balance does not rollover at end of year. Texas Senate caps rollover to \$20,000.
