AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE TITLE 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS) TO ADD NEW SECTION 1-1-15 REGARDING REFERENCES WITHIN CITY CODE TO A DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, OR OFFICE OF THE CITY; AND AMENDING CITY CODE SECTION 2-11-16 (INFORMATION SECURITY OFFICE) TO CREATE THE INFORMATION SECURITY PROGRAM TO EFFECTUATE CONSOLIDATION OF THE INFORMATION SECURITY OFFICE AND COMMUNICATIONS AND TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. Title 1 (General Provisions) is amended to add new Section 1-1-15 to read:

§ 1-1-15 – REFERENCES TO DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, OR OFFICE OF THE CITY.

A reference in this Code to a specific department, agency, or office of the city includes its successor department, agency, or office.

PART 2. City Code Section 2-11-16 (*Information Security Office*) is amended to read:

§ 2-11-16 INFORMATION SECURITY [OFFICE] PROGRAM.

- (A) The <u>citywide</u> information security [<u>office</u>] <u>program</u> is created[<u>as an administrative office and shall report to the deputy or assistant city manager as assigned</u>].
- (B) The chief information security officer, or staff designated by the city manager, leads [the office and manages] the citywide information security program.
- (C) Each <u>city</u> official and employee shall comply with the information security requirements defined in and subsequent to this chapter.
- (D) The information security [office]program shall:
 - (1) perform information security duties;
 - (2) establish and maintain a citywide information security program and information security architecture;
