Commison on Immigrant Affairs	Edit Bylaws Article 3 (A) Membership - to include three Commission approved stakeholder members.	The commision approved these bylaw changes to help with the challenges we've had. Adding community stakeholder seats will give us more flexibility to meet quorum and also bring in valuable perspectives and expertise we might be missing.	Staff does not recommend. Stakeholder positions impose additional responsibilities on commissioners to review and nominate appointees, which have historically been challenging to fill and sustain. These amendments would also increase the quorum requirement, a recent difficulty for the commission. As mentioned during the Dec A&F meeting, with a renewed committment for filling vacancies with members committed to regular attendance and promptly addressing any attendance concerns these amendments should not be necessary. If this proposed amendment is recommended for approval, an ordinance would be necessary to amend City Code § 2-1-126.
Zero Waste Advisory Commission	Edit Bylaws Article 8 (A) Committes/Working Groups - to remove the Organics Management Committee.	This amendment is needed because the Organics Management Committee's function is already covered by the Universal Recycling Ordinance Committee. Furthermore, the OMC has not convened for several years now.	Staff supports the removal of this committee.
