Pursuant to the terms of various agreements, Austin Public Health has provided public health services throughout the unincorporated areas of Travis County (County) since 1985. City and County staff worked together for several years to consolidate the patchwork of agreements and amendments for these services, resulting in an interlocal agreement (ILA) that was approved by the County Commissioners Court and City Council on September 27, 2007, and October 18, 2007, respectively. This original ILA was renewed several times prior to adoption of the current ILA.

This action will authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the interlocal agreement for a sevenmonth period beginning on October 1, 2024, in an amount not to exceed \$4,095,973.

Pursuant to this ILA, Austin Public Health will continue to provide public health services, such as HIV outreach and prevention, immunizations, disease surveillance, vital records, chronic disease prevention, communicable disease services, epidemiology and disease surveillance, Health Authority services, tuberculosis elimination, and environmental health services.
