ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Family Connects is a voluntary, short-term nurse home visiting program offered to every family with newborn infants to maximize full representation of our community and community acceptance of the program goals, which include the following:

1. To connect with mothers or primary caregivers to support parenting skills and self-efficacy.
2. To assess each family’s unique strengths and needs.
3. To connect the family with needed community services, such as health care, childcare, and financial and social support to promote family functioning and child well-being.

There were more than 16,000 babies born in Travis County last year. Research suggests that 95 percent of families have health needs within the first few weeks of being home. For many families, a single visit from a health professional can provide support and access to resources that lead to significant positive outcomes. Families that could benefit from more intensive or long-term support are referred to other appropriate programs.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, Austin Public Health’s need for continued funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
