Approve a resolution nominating Clinical Pathology Laboratories, Inc., located at 9200 Wall Street, Austin, TX 78754, for designation by the Governor's Office of Economic Development and Tourism as a single Texas Enterprise Project in accordance with Texas Government Code Chapter 2303. Clinical Pathology Laboratories, Inc. (CPL) is a full-service laboratory led by a team of pathologists with over 7,000 staff members worldwide that develop and support clinical and anatomical pathology services. In Austin, CPL employs over 950 people. The qualified business site is located at 9200 Wall Street.

Over the next five years, CPL anticipates job retention and investment. As a result of this project, CPL plans to invest over \$5 million to upgrade its facility with more efficient and impactful machinery and equipment. CPL expects to retain 490 existing full-time jobs for benefit and create ten new full-time jobs under the Enterprise Zone Program. The Enterprise Zone designation would not include any additional incentive from the City. Although the City is required to nominate a company, the state is ultimately responsible for the designation. If designated by the state, CPL will be eligible for a refund of state sales and use taxes.

This item requests the Council's support of a Texas Enterprise Zone Single Designation. CPL seeks to submit its Texas Enterprise Zone Application to the Office of the Texas Governor for the June 2, 2025, application

round.
