ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: The Economic Development Department's Cultural Arts Division is receiving \$500,000 from the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) for the 2021 NEA American Rescue Plan Local Arts Agencies for Sub-granting program, to support a sub-grants to benefit Austin Arts Education organizations and Teaching Arts, prioritizing those led by and actively serving residents in lower income areas of Austin. Due to a lack of appropriate funds, the city has not been able to fully invest in arts education. It is anticipated that over 150 organizations and individuals will apply. These grant dollars will help stabilize our local arts education organizations as COVID continues to impact the local arts and culture ecosystem.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the Economic Development Department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
