ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE BUILDING OFFICIAL TO EXEMPT CERTAIN ELECTRICAL ACTIVITIES FROM THE ELECTRICAL PERMIT REQUIREMENT; EXTENDING THE DEADLINE FOR CERTAIN PERMIT APPLICATIONS; WAIVING THE ELECTRICAL CODE'S REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN: PART 1. FINDINGS.

- (1) On January 31, 2023, a Winter Storm Warning was issued for the Austin area due to forecasted severe winter weather posing an imminent threat of widespread and severe property damage, injury, and loss of life due to a combination of prolonged freezing temperatures and rain resulting in heavy ice accumulation on freeways, surface roads and trees.
- (2) From January 31, 2023, through February 2, 2022, the City experienced prolonged freezing temperatures and freezing rain which resulted in significant ice accumulation on freeways, surface roads and trees ("2023 Winter Weather Event").
- (3) On February 3, 2023, Mayor Kirk Watson issued a Declaration of Local Disaster because the 2023 Winter Weather Event caused widespread and severe property damage and injury due to prolonged freezing temperatures, freezing rain, and ice accumulation.
- (4) On February 4, 2021, Governor Greg Abbott issued a Declaration of State of Disaster because the 2023 Winter Weather Event caused widespread and severe property damage and injury due to significant ice accumulations, subfreezing temperatures, freezing rain and sleet, hazardous travel disruptions, power outages and heavy rain.
- (5) During the 2023 Winter Weather Event, there was significant damage to electric infrastructure. It is expected that much of the electrical infrastructure damage will require small-scale repairs.
- (6) The City's Electrical Code requires an individual to obtain a permit for most electrical activities. In this instance, the Building Official expects that the
